## Paper Plate Peek-a-Boo Bunny

### Supplies

- Paper plate
- White card
- Paint
- Googly eyes
- Cotton wool ball
- 2 split pins
- Felt-tip pens



- Pencil
- Paint Brush
- Scissors





Take the card and place the paper plate onto it, then draw around the paper plate.



Using felt-tip pens, draw some whiskers and a mouth onto the bunny.



Now choose a colour for your bunny and paint both the card circle and the paper plate in this colour, then leave to dry.



Also stick some googly eyes onto the face.



Cut out the card circle and fold it in half. Shape the circle into two ear-shaped ovals by making one end slightly pointed and making the other end slightly squared; these will form the bunny's ears.



Finally, join the ears onto the head by pushing the split pins through both the ears and the head. Then pull out the split pins at the back of the plate to secure.



Using glue, stick the cotton wool ball to the middle of the paper plate.



# Paper Plate Peek-a-Boo Bunny



#### Supplies

- Paper plate
- White card
- Paint
- Googly eyes
- Cotton wool ball
- 2 split pins
- Felt-tip pens



- Paint Brush
- Scissors





**Step 1.** Take the card and place the paper plate onto it, then draw around the paper plate.



Step 2. Now choose a colour for your bunny and paint both the card circle and the paper plate in this colour, then leave to dry.



Step 3. Cut out the card circle and fold it in half. Shape the circle into two earshaped ovals by making one end slightly pointed and making the other end slightly squared; these will form the bunny's ears.

**Step 4.** Using glue, stick the cotton wool ball to the middle of the paper plate.



**Step 5.** Using felt-tip pens, draw some whiskers and a mouth onto the bunny.



**Step 6.** Also stick some googly eyes onto the face.



Step 7. Finally, join the ears onto the head by pushing the split pins through both the ears and the head. Then pull out the split pins at the back of the plate to secure.
