This has developed their subject knowledge and confidence in delivering areas of the curriculum that they identified as 'targets' within their self-evaluation questionnaire. It also means that 58% of our teaching staff who deliver P.E has had direct involvement with our specialist sports coach this year. - A sporting after school club has been delivered every week during the Summer term. These clubs have been free for our children and have targeted KS2 children. In total, 60 children have attended these clubs (the maximum amount of possible children). - Intra-school competitions have been delivered during lunch times and our NSSW celebrations for all of our children to participate in. In total, he has delivered 17 individual intra-school competitions for all of our children. Each of these competitions is celebrated by awarding 1st, 2nd & 3rd placed children a medal. These competitions have reduced behavioural incidents during lunch times and have promoted values such as sportsmanship, accepting defeat and individual target setting. Furthermore, the competitions have provided active opportunities for all of our children and as a result, they have contributed to our children meeting the government guidelines of 30 minutes of physical activity per day. Additionally, team-based intra-school competitions have also been delivered this year. In total, we scheduled for 7 competitions to be delivered after school (1 was cancelled due to CO-VID) and 6 were delivered during our NSSW celebrations. These competitions promoted the School Games Values and awarded bonus points for successfully demonstrating these during play. The after-school competitions also provided an opportunity for 4 of our school prefects to organise & officiate sporting activity. - The specialist sports coach organises and runs inter-school competitions for the schools within the Halewood cluster. These have provided opportunities for 'B', 'C' & SEND teams to participate in competitive fixtures, thus increasing the amount of children participating in Level 2 competition.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Additional swimming lessons were provided for Y6 children who did not meet the expected guidelines set by the government. The lessons were delivered by our specialist sports coach. Before the additional lessons, 49% of our Y6 cohort could swim 25m confidently and could use a range of strokes effectively over 10m, whilst 54% could perform safe self-rescue in different situations. After the additional lessons, 61% of our Y6 cohort could swim 25m confidently, 66% could use a range of strokes effectively over 10m and 83% could perform safe self-rescue in different situations.

In total, every child participated for 2 hours. This decision was taken after an extensive process involving the P.E & Sport co-ordinator reviewing the subject, analysing OFSTED's P.E subject view document and trialling a number of different schemes. The PE Hub's scheme of work was chosen based on a number of factors: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o feedback from staff members was positive for several schemes, but PE Hub was deemed the best because of its extensive resources and simplified format o Some areas of the curriculum planning have multiple 6-week units, giving the opportunity to provide longer coverage of certain topics, thus allowing for a 'mastery' approach o Planning for EYFS/KS1 is skill specific rather than sport specific. This supports the findings from OFSTED's PE review document o the P.E & Sport co-ordinator's belief that the resources would best suit the school's new assessment system of end points <p>Overall, this scheme will support our objectives of returning children to pre-CO-VID levels better than our previous scheme of work and any other scheme analysed.</p>	within subject folder

Swimming Assessment for the past 3 academic years (2019-20, 2020-21 & 2021-22)

At Plantation Primary, our children usually take part in swimming lessons from Y2 to Y6. These occur over a half term per year group at Halewood Leisure Centre.

In the 2019-20 academic year, we delivered extra swimming lessons for those children not meeting the expected guidelines set by the government. The table below shows the achievements of our children before and after the extra swimming lessons:

In the 2020-21 academic year, the Co-vid pandemic and its changing guidelines and requirements meant that we were unable to deliver school swimming lessons for any of our children during the academic year, despite arranging several times to do so.

In the 2021-22 academic year, we delivered swimming lessons for Y3-6 children. We scheduled to deliver swimming lessons for Y2 children, but cancellations to swimming lessons at the beginning of the academic year meant that Y2 could no longer attend. We did deliver extra swimming lessons for those Y6 children not meeting the expected guidelines set by the government. The table below shows the achievements of our children before and after the extra swimming lessons:
